Overview

Health Research in the Americas IV: HIV/TB is a workshop designed for investigators, scholars, students, and clinicians interested in international research. The program will concentrate on HIV and TB in the Latin American and Caribbean areas that are supported by the University of Miami Fogarty International Training Program. University of Miami Fogarty faculty, Fogarty trainees, and invited guests will give presentations on a wide range of topics related to HIV/TB including: scaling up treatment; prevention and treatment of pediatric infection; stigma and discrimination; new diagnostic techniques; and opportunistic infections and co-infections. Participants will be able to compare experiences, share concerns, and discuss issues with Fogarty faculty and trainees. The workshop encourages questions and open critique. By the end of the program, attendees will have an increased understanding of the HIV and TB epidemics in developing countries, and knowledge of strategies for optimal prevention and care in the age of treatment scale-up.
